





GENERAL BUSINESS:

It was discussed whether an Honorarium should be changed to Recognition or a Koha. If a Major Conflict is identified that Committee member:

- 1. Should declare it before any discussions begin.
- 2. Should not vote on the issue.
- 3. Will have speaking rights limited primarily to answering questions on background, details etc.
